EASTWOOD HISTORY WALK



On 3rd July a group of 20 people enjoyed an information session in the Memorial Room followed by a walk to see various places of interest in the history of Eastwood.

Before the information session Eleanor helped with preparation and morning tea was served. The talk in the Memorial Room was accompanied by pictures on

the screen. It included information and pictures of the three Methodist churches built in Lakeside Road and St Andrews Eastwood. Helen Ramsay was very helpful earlier with information, pictures and charts from the historical display she prepared with Barbara Horrocks for Sundays 25th June and 2nd July.

Marion led the information session and Malcolm shared stories of some of the early Eastwood people. So we heard about the troubled life of John Love (the first colonial landholder), the successes and tragedy of Gregory Blaxland, the hunting and racing of Edward Terry (his racecourse was on the present public school site) – and of course Maria Ann Smith, 'Granny Smith'. Tennyson was our all-day translator.

At the start of the morning walk we viewed the lower oval where once there was a lake. The walk took us to St Kevin's and to Marist College to view 'Eastwood House'. We walked up Midson Road and into the Cavanstone housing development to spend some time there in the brick pit heritage area. Everyone enjoyed a short bush section of Terrys Creek Walk alongside Terrys Creek and seeing the giant Sydney Blue Gums. We traced parts of the Creek in canals later. In Auld Ave people were interested to see 'Ripley' and 'Hetherwold' (formerly Braemar College), both built in the 1880s.


Chatting around the tables during lunch in a restaurant in Rowe St was a time for people to get to know each other better.

One of the participants said later "It was such a success and such a friendly group where everyone mingled. It didn't matter if you spoke Mandarin or English!!"

After lunch we studied the plaques in the plaza pavement, saw where
