# Words of Comfort and Hope Rev. Amelia Koh-Butler

I sometimes wonder why the Author of Life would allow suffering in life and the parting of death. The whole life-death thing remains a mystery. We don't really know. We haven't been there.

Sometimes, deep sacred truth cannot be expressed in words of logic – but we get more of a hint in poetry and in song. Asking among friends, these verses seemed fitting:

- 1. Love divine, all loves excelling,
  Joy of Heav'n to earth come down;
  Fix in us thy humble dwelling;
  All thy faithful mercies crown!
  Jesus, Thou art all compassion,
  Pure unbounded love Thou art;
  Visit us with Thy salvation,
  Enter every trembling heart.
- 2. Breathe, O breathe Thy loving Spirit Into every troubled breast!
  Let us all in Thee inherit;
  Let us find that second rest.
  Take away our bent to sinning;
  Alpha and Omega be;
  End of faith, as its beginning,
  Set our hearts at liberty.

How we live after facing death tells us a lot about a person. After her beloved Arthur died, June continued to live to her capacity. Even during COVID, she would drop down to the church to speak through the window to Michelle. She would still be offering an encouraging word.

In the Denistone/Eastwood Church Community, June was known for jams and pickles. She was a behind-the-scenes person, always willing to help. I think her ongoing attitude of generous encouragement was a great mark of her faith.

It is not hard to believe that THEN she believed that NOW she will be banqueting with Arthur in a new and delightful life, freed from the pains and sorrows of this world, separated for a time from her loved ones, but with the promise of complete healing and wholeness.

She was a woman of both faithfulness (in how she behaved to others) and faith (in how she related to God).

I only met June a few times this year, but she obviously appreciated hymns and she lived so positively.

When you are a widow, you can't really help but consider what is beyond. June's attitude makes me think the last two verses of that Charles Wesley hymn are even more fitting:

- 3. Come, Almighty to deliver,
  Let us all Thy life receive;
  Suddenly return, and never,
  Nevermore Thy temples leave.
  Thee we would be always blessing,
  Serve Thee as Thy hosts above,
  Pray and praise Thee without ceasing,
  Glory in Thy perfect love.
- 4. Finish, then, Thy new creation;
  Pure and spotless let us be;
  Let us see Thy great salvation
  Perfectly restored in Thee;
  Changed from glory into glory,
  Till in Heav'n we take our place,
  Till we cast our crowns before Thee,
  Lost in wonder, love, and praise.

You have promised that out of darkness light shall shine, light that is the knowledge of your glory in the face of Jesus Christ.
