## GOOD START TO YEAR FOR EUC ENGLISH CLASSES

The Saturday before 2023 classes started on 6th February several volunteers and some of the students with better English made use of the Lunar New Year Festival in Eastwood Park to let people know about our English classes. Signs were carried, saying 'Ask me about English classes', in Chinese as well as English.

If people showed interest, they were given information about the classes.

Classes began the following Monday. A good number of students came to the church, including some who were returning, either from last year, or from before

COVID. Many were new students. Since then new students have come each Monday morning. By the end of February, over 30 students were attending on Monday mornings at the church, in 7 classes. Zoom classes continue on different days of the week.

### SYDNEY ALLIANCE ASSEMBLY

This was held on 28th February at the Morley Centre at Westmead. The venue emphasised the focus on Western Sydney by the Assembly in the lead up to the NSW election on 25th March.



Sydney Alliance has been negotiating with both sides of politics over many months prior to the Assembly. The aim of the Assembly was to lock in commitments by the Treasurer Matt Kean, and Shadow Treasurer, Daniel Mookhey, on issues of housing, planning, energy, climate-proofing rentals, rental rights, an energy hub, temporary migrants, and continuing regular meetings with Sydney Alliance. People from Western Sydney spoke of their personal experiences of these issues. Memorable speakers were those who testified to their own experience of how extreme heat in western Sydney affects learning, sleeping and everyday living. Matt Kean and Daniel Mookhey spoke briefly. Mr Mookhey spoke about his experience of growing up in Western Sydney, before continuing, as Mr Kean did also, to give a short outline of some of their parties' plans if they win government. Both politicians made important commitments about all the issues of concern.

'It will be significant if the incoming Government legislates to end 'no ground' evictions of renters. Sydney Alliance has worked hard with the politicians on this issue.
